Question for Reflection

One commentator on Luke 6:17-26 writes, "Blessed' (makarios) does not simply describe a state of happiness or bliss. Rather, it refers in a theological sense to one's standing before God (Deut. 33:29; Pss. 1:1; 40:4)." As you reflect on the blessings and woes in Luke's Gospel and on the use of the word "happy" in Psalm 1:1 and "blessed" in Jeremiah 17:7, how does this meaning of "blessed" or "happy" contrast with contemporary uses of this word, even by some preachers? What is one change you can make in your own life before God that would bring you into closer accord with Jesus' understanding of blessedness?
